 body into the hands of God by the blessed Oblation of my Saviour the one at the time of
 my dissolution the other at the time of my Resurrection and for Such worldly Goods as the
 Goodness of God hath bestowed on me I give and bequeath in manner & form following
 Vizt I give & bequeath to my well beloved Wife Mary Major half the land & plantation
 whereon I now dwell during her widowhood with half the houses orchards pastures and
 Benifitts to them belonging during her widowhood Also I give to my said Wife Mary Major
 Six Slaves London Willism Joshua Sarah Elizabeth and Mary with all their increase to
 her her heirs and Assigns for ever I give and bequeath to my Son Littleton Scarborough
 Major all my Land to him his heirs & assigns forever only the before mentioned half to
 my wife as aforesaid also I give to my said Son my Slaves Tobias Daniel Solomon John,
 Charles and Comfort to him his heirs and Assigns forever also I give my said Son
 Littleton Scarborough Major the half of all my Estate whatsoever not by me before given
 to be Equally Divided Between him & my wife Mary all my Estate whatsoever and where-
 soever Vizt And of this my Last will and Testament do Constitute and appoint my wife
 Mary Major my Execut^x & my Son Littleton Scarborough Major my Execut^{rs} As Witness my hand
 & Seal this 11th Day of December 1729
