being very Sick and Weak in body but of perfect mind & memory thanks be given unto God
therefore calling unto mind the mortallity of my body & knowing that it is appointed
for all men once to die do make & ordain this my Last will & Testament that is to Say
principally & first of all I give & Recommend my Soul into the hands of God that gave it
& my body I Recommend to the Earth to be buried in decent Christian manner at the discre-

tion of my Estate nothing Doubting but at the Generall Resurrection I shall Receive the
same again by the Mighty power of God & as Touching Such worldly Estate wherewith it hath
pleased God to bless in this life I give devise & dispose of the Same in the following
manner and form - Imprimis I give and bequeeth to my Two Youngest Sons Samuel & Henry the
plantation whereon I now live with all my Land thereunto adjoining my will is that my
Youngest Son Samuel Rogers should have my house & plantation to a maple and so across
the old Feild to a Great pine mark'd and So across from that pine to Stratton Burtons
line to them & their heirs for ever if either of my Two Sons should die then to the next
Youngest of my Sons Item I give to my Youngest Son Samuel all my Hells for the use of
the plantation and my Chest with the Goods I leave to my Son Samuel after my decease a
Sett of Iron Wedges to my Youngest Son Samuel Item I Give unto my Son Henry a bed and
furniture thereunto belonging I give to my two Youngest Sons all the Iron Working Tools
belonging to the Plantation Item I give y^e half of all my Pewter to my Two Youngest
Sons Item I give unto my Son Edmond a long Gun thats called Beedy & a pair of hand
Mill Stones & a Cow Item I Give unto my Son Richard a hundred acres of Land joyning to
the Dry Swamp & a Short Gun to him and his heirs for ever and if my Son Richard should
