our Lord Christ seventeen hundred and sixtyswo I Benjamin Brown
now being in perfect memory do make this my last Will & Testament
and dispose of my Estate in the manner following: to wit: I give to
my Beloved Wife Sarah two negro women the one named Jane and
the other named Bell: next I give to my Daughter Agnes one
thousand acres of land lying on the Raged Mountains. Beginning
on Samuell Wells and so up including foxes & Pickels: next I give
to my Son Banzila Brown and his Heirs for ever all that Tract of
Land I own on the lower side of the River between the River & the
Raged Mountains and one Negro Man named Tom: Next
I give to my Son Benajah Brown and his Heirs forever that

Land and plantation whereon I now live also the old plantation
 and land belonging to it on the pasture fence and one negro boy
 named Cypil and one Negro Girl named fianch: Next I give to my
 son Werna Brown and his heirs forever the land and plantation
 called the Rich hollow also one piece of Land lying near John
 Snoves and one Negro boy bales Will: Next I give to my son
 Dornice Brown and his heirs for ever that Tract of land bounded
 between Robert Harris Benjamin Thurman and James Woods, as
 far as the big branch southward also the new plantation and land
 adjoining on the pasture fence Mountain on the old County line and
 one negro Woman named Venus and her Childs Peter
 Next I give to my son Bezaleel Brown and his heirs forever that tract
 of Land none by the name of the Bear corn field and all the Land
 on the West side of the South fork of the River and one Negro Girl
 called Betty: Next I give to my son Doughtery Brown and his heirs
 forever the land and plantation at the head of Roock Creek and that
 Land and plantation called Statums and one Negro boy named
 dick and one Negro Girl named Jane: The remaining part of my
 Estate both Real and personall after my debts being paid and
 discharged to be Equally divided among my seven last Children and I
 do appoint my sons W^m & Benjamin Brown Executors of this my last
 Will and testament given under my hand and seal this 15th Day of
 April in the Year of our Lord one thousand seven hundred & eighty two

hundred and forty acres lying & being in Goochland County according
to a deed made me by John Lewis, to her during her life and
after her demise to my son Richard, him and his heirs forever
whereas my dearly beloved Wife is now with child & if she should
bring a Boy I also bequeath unto him one certain Tract of Land
lying on Duckingham Creek on Hardware River in the County
of Albemarle containing two hundred Acres, but in case it should
be a Daughter then my desire is that my Wife should have this
tract of Land in same manner as the first but after her decease
to return to my aforesaid son Richard, I further do give unto
my dearly beloved Wife the sum of fifty Pounds currency to be
raised out of all my Debts & other demands & the said sum
I do desire she may lay out in any manner she may think
