 and my Brother Charles Gilliam's and my Sister Mary
 Gilliam's Estates Decare I desire may be Equally divided
 Between my two Sisters Ann & Mary Gilliam I give to
 my Brother John Gilliam wife a Brass Kettle My part
 of the money that is lent to my Brother John Gilliam and
 what money I have by me — I desire the rest of my
 Estate may be Equally divided between my two Sisters
 Ann & Mary Gilliam, I do Appoint Richard Pennell and
 Hugh Pine Morris my Executors to see that this my will
 is put in force according to my intend, and I revoke and
 Disannul all other wills, allowing this to be my Last
 will & Testament the date & year above written
