 I James Hindhead of Albemarle County being much Indisposed in Body
 but of a Perfect Mind & Memory and calling to Mind the Mortality of my Body
 Do constitute this my last will & Testament That is to say I first recommend
 my Soul to God who have it me and my Body to be buried in a brief & an
 Decent Manner at the Discretion of my Exors and as to what worldly Estate I
 have pleased God to bless me with I have & bequeath it in the following
 Manner Viz. First I give & bequeath unto Henry my Wife & James my
 youngest Son all my Land with Liberty to my said wife and the other Exors
 under named, to sell said Land as soon as they think proper and to purchase
 more Land with the Money arising from the Sale again I give & bequeath to
 Thomas my eldest Son one Three year Old Bay Mare with Saddle & bridle
 And to John my second Son one Bay Two year Old Horse with Saddle &
 bridle The Rest of my Movable Estate I give & bequeath unto Jean my
 Wife to be by her and the Rest of my Exors laid out for the Rearing & main-
 taining the Rest of my younger Children and I do appoint Jean my Wife
 Thomas my eldest Son & Mariani Eldest my Son in Law Executor of this
 my last will and Testament utterly annulling all other former wills and
 Testaments and Ratifying and Confirming this as my last In witness
