being of perfect mind & Memory blessed to God do make & constitute this
my last Will & Testament in Manner & form following VIZ I first of
all Commit my Soul into the hands of Almighty God hoping that the Merits
of Christ to receive Pardon & remission of my sins & my body to be
decently Interred at the discretion of My Executors hereafter Named
& Secondly as to the distribution of my Worldly Goods I Imprimis
first of all Give devise & bequeath to my beloved brother Thomas
Furpin my four hundred acres of Land in Cumberland County on the
Branches of Muddy Creek where my Plantation now is to him &
John his heirs forever I then Give & bequeath to my said Brother
Thomas Nine Negroes to wit. Will, Charles, Toby, Feathering, Nan,
Patt, Sarah, little Patt, & little Sally with their Increase to him
& to his heirs forever I then Give devise & bequeath to my Nephew
William Mosley five hundred & sixty acres of Land in Allmarale
County on the branches of Millers Creek being the Land of Plan-
tation I now hold & Occupy to him the said William & to his
heirs forever I then I also give & bequeath to the said William
Mosley Eight Negroes to wit Ben, York, Robin, Cesar, Bridgett
& young Maid gett Rich & Tris with their Increase to him &
his heirs forever I then all my Stock of Horses, Cattle & Swine
that is on & belonging to my Millers Creek Plantation I also Give to the
said William Mosley & I also Give to the said William Mosley two
Feather Bedes & three Trunkers my dish & Chest & Chest of Drawers
I then Give to my brother Thomas Furpin all my Stock of Cattle
Horses & Swine on & belonging to my Plantation at Muddy Creek
I then Give & bequeath to my Niece Mary Goode my Negro Girl
named Siddy with her Increase I then Give to my sister Mary Goode

I the Husband Robert Good's Son Negroes to wit Pompey Tom Henry
 Wm. Pitty Fanny & Meara & do direct that if my said Sister
 Die before her husband that then the above mentioned Last & Lawer
 Gals decend to her three Children Namely Robert, Frances & Mary
 in Equal Division at the Death of their Father Tom Good to my
 Niece Obadience Baze fifty pounds Currant Money I Give to
 my Niece Prudence Branch fifty pounds Currant Money I Give
 to my Niece Mary Branch fifty pounds Currant Money I Give
 to my Niece Elizabeth Trent fifty pounds Currant Money
 & do direct direct that Thomas Turpin, Robert Good & William
 Moseley respectively do each of them pay one third of the two
 hundred pounds hereaftered To my four Nieces out of their
 Consideration of the Legacies I have Given them Item all the rest
 of my Estate not before hereaftered I Give to be Equally Divided
 between My Brothers Thomas Turpin & Robert Good & do appoint them
 Executors of this my Last Will & Testament revoking all Wills by me
 heretofore made & direct that my Estate be not appraised for the
 Whereof I have hereunto Set my hand & Seal this 16th day of
 June one thousand seven hundred & fifty three
