 just debts I do give & dispose of the Remainder of my Estate in the
 manner & form following, — Item I do give & bequeath unto myself
 beloved wife Mary all my Lands & other goods as well moveables as
 Immoveables to be quietly possessed & enjoyed by her during her
 Natural life or widowhood all I give & bequeath unto my Dafter
 Dashes one Saw Half and one fether Bed and one fower that to it
 belongs also I give & bequeath to my Dafter Elizabeth one Saw and
 half one fether Bed & furniture & also Thars except the Log, fies it
 is my will & Desire all my Lands goods Chattels as well moveable
 as Immoveable after my wifes decease may be sold and the money
 Equally divided between my Children then living or to be living
 that if any of them dies without an heir, that their part may be equally
 divided between my Children then living, I do give & bequeath unto
 Dafter Stonefords part to her two Children, to be Equally divided
 between them, to help raise them & School them and I do constitute
 and appoint my well beloved wife Mary and Juden Goucart and
 my Son Joseph and my Son Sherwood to hold and see execute
 Executors of this my Last will & Testament, as Witnesses whereat
 I have hereunto set my hand this 19th day of May 1773
