unto all men once to die, Do make & Ordain this my Last will and
Testament that is to say principally and first of all I give my and
Recommend my soul into the hands of Almighty God that gave it
and my body I Recommend to the Earth to be buried in a decent Christ-
ian Burial at the discretion of my Friends Nothing Doubting
but at the General Resurrection I shall Receive the Same again by the
mighty Power of God, and as Touching such worldly Estate whereunto
it has pleased God to bestow me in this Life, I give, Devise, and Dispose
of the Same in the following manner I form -

First of all I give to my (Dear Brother Samuel Bucksteh my
Broad cloth Coat & waistcoat and Breeches, and a pair of Leather
Breeches, and my Blue Virginia cloth Hat, Breeches & Waistcoat,
And I give to James Hill my Great Gile and my Blue waistcoat,
Virginia cloth Gile, and my Sagathy waistcoat and my yellow Vir-
ginia cloth Gile and a Cotton waistcoat

My Land I give to my Brother James Bucksteh and he
Must pay for what part of my Land is not paid for, and as the
Money that is found due to me by my Executors after paying my
Other Debts is to go towards paying for the Land

I give to John Robertson who married my Sister all my linen
Close, and my bed & Furniture, and all my household Furniture
In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand & Seal this
first day of July One Thousand Seven hundred & Seventy four
