 knowing that it is appointed for all Men once to die & being
 willing to settle such Things as The Lord of his Infinite Mercy
 hath been pleased to bestow on Me Do make constitute and
 Ordain this my Last Will & Testament revoking all other Wills
 by me Made either by Word or Writing and First of all I give
 & commend my Soul into the Hands of almighty God & my
 Body to the Earth to be Buried in a Decent Manner as my
 Executors hereafter Named shall think fit hoping that I
 shall receive full pardon of all my Sins Trusting that I
 shall receive my Body again at the Resurrection and be
 glorified with the Lord Jesus Christ when he shall come to take
 vengeance upon those that have not God in Conscience & for further
 I will that all my Lawfull Debts were paid I give to my Wife
 Mary Smith my Share of all my Moveable Estate to remain
 hers During her Life or Widowhood if my Brother gains my
 Fathers Estate to every one of my Children 30th at the Lame time
 of Age or Lawfull Marriage I give my Gun to my Son Joseph at the
 Day of my death I make my Wife my Heir & Soul Executor & after
 her death my Negro & moveable Estate to be Divided between my three
 Children the Names of which are these Joseph Smith Larkin Smith
 William Mattha Thomas give the Smith surname as a one
 die of these before they arrive at the Age of 18. the part belonging
 to the Deceased shall be Equally divided among the Rest.
