 I give to his Son John Gilliam Ten Pounds which is in my
 Brother Peter Gilliam's hands, my part of my father's Estate
 and my Brother Charles Gilliam's and my Sister Mary
 Gilliam's Estates Deceased I desire may be Equally divided
 Between my two Sisters Ann & Mary Gilliam I give to
 my Brother John Gilliam wife a Brass Kettle My part
 of the money that is Lent to my Brother John Gilliam and
 what money I have by me — I desire the Rest of my
 Estate may be Equally Divided between my two Sisters
 Ann & Mary Gilliam, I do Appoint Richard Bennett and
 Hugh Price Morris my Executors to see that this my will
 is put in force according to my intend, and I revoke and
 Disannul all other wills, allowing this to be my Last
 will & Testament the date & year above written

 named Bob & likewise one Large Red Bull — I give to my
 Son Henry Fury all the Rest of my Estate & do Enjoin him to pay
 to Mr. J. H. Scott five Pounds which I give him Lastly
 I do Constitute & Appoint my Son Henry Fury Executor of
 this my said will, Signed Sealed

Examination distinctly and Openly without delay you
shall Send & Certify Inclosed together with this writ and
writing annexed to our Justice of Allmarle County Writ
John Nicholas Esq. of our Said Count of Allmarle at the
Court house the 21st day of October 1772 in the 25th year
of our Reign
