hereafter Deceased) unto my beloved Wife Ann for & during her natural life & after her
decease the said Land & plantation with all the goods & Chattels hereby Deceased to my said
Wife I give & bequeath to my Daughter Elizabeth Hall & the heirs of her body forever
but in case my Daughter Elizabeth die without heirs of her body living at her Death
Then I give & bequeath the aforesaid Land & plantation with the appendances unto
my Grand son John Hall Tread & his heirs forever I give & bequeath to my said Daughter
Elizabeth one Feather Bed & furniture I give to my son John Hall one shilling I give
I give to my son Richard ^{Hall} one shilling. I give to my Daughter Mary Tread
one shilling I give to my Daughter Ann Wife of George Duncan one shilling I give to
my Daughter Jane Wife of John Duncan one shilling I appoint my Wife Ann
Daughter Elizabeth Executrices & Henry ^{Tindal} & Thomas Tindal Executors of this
my said Will & I revoke all Others at any Time by me heretofore made

powers of God & as touching my Worldly Estate whereunto it hath pleased God to bless me in
this life I Give Devise & dispose of the same in the following manner before me Imprimis

Bundum one Shilling I Give to my Mathew Howard one Shilling I Give
to my son John Tanner one Shilling I Give to my son William Tanner one Shilling
I Give & bequeath to Patrick O'Brien & Mary Maxwell the Remainder of my
Estate to be Equally Divided between the said Patrick O'Brien & ^{her} Mary Maxwell Willing so

Mobley's Will In the Name of God Amen the Twentieth fourth day of Janry 1760 I Samuel
Mobley of the County of Albemarle being Sick & Weak in body but of perfect mind
& Memory Thanks be unto Almighty God for it do make & Ordain This my Last Will &
Testament in Manner & forme following first I Give & bequeath to my son Samuel
Mobley to him & his heirs forever one certain Tract & parcel of Land in this County of Albemarle
in the province of Maryland (also) a parcel of Land where William French now Dwells
in Virginia in Albemarle County to Extend up to the mouth of albert & up that Gut or
branch to the back line to him & his heirs as aforesaid I likewise I Give & bequeath
to my son aforesaid one Negro Woman Named Nan to him & his heirs forever I Give
I Give & bequeath to my Grand Daughter Sarah Mobley to her & her heirs forever
one Negro Boy Named Realer I Give & bequeath to my son James Mobley to him &
his heirs forever the plantation he now Dwells on & all the rest of my Estate real &
personal & also all Debts Due to me for which he shall discharge all my Debts
that I owe in Virginia my wills that my Estate be not appraised & that I likewise
Constitute make & Ordain my son James Mobley my sole Executor of this my
