In the Name of God Amen I Thomas Roberts of the parish of St Anne  
in the County of Albemarle being in perfect senses blessed by God first do this  
day the twenty fourth of October in the year of our Lord one thousand seven hundred  
& fifty nine make & publish this my last Will & Testament in manner  
following that is to say I desire that my Debts may before I paid by my  
Executors first I Give to my Loving wife Litty Roberts that part of her Estate  
that came by her Father Thomas Martin & if my wife should die  
without her I Give that part of her Estate to her sister Milly Martin  
that came by her Father Likewise I Give to my wife Litty Roberts  
My horse Bridle & Saddle & all my Stock of Cattel Likewise I Give  
to my wife Litty Roberts the Crop that is in her fathers hands  
I Give to my wife Litty Roberts my plantation of two hundred & thirty  
Six Acres of Land joining John Lyon in the Rich Cove
