In the Name of God Amen this fourth Day of September one thousand seven Hundred & Sixty. I Peter Lyon Sen^r of the County of Albemarle & Parish of St. Ann being sick in body but of good & perfect Memory thank be to almighty God & calling to Remembrance y^e uncertain State of this Transitory Life & that all Flesh must yield unto death when it shall please God to call; Do make constitute ordain & declare this my last will and Testament in Manner & Form following Revoking & Annulling by these Presents all & every Testament & Testaments Will & Wills heretofore by me made & declared either by word or writing & this is to be taken only for my last will & Testament & none other & now for y^e settling of my Temporal Estate & Goods & Chattels & Debts as hath pleased God for above my Demerits to bestow upon me I do order give & Dispose the same in manner and Form following, (that is to say) First I will that all these Debts & Dues I owe in Right or Account by my Death or Funeral shall be paid or to be paid within convenient time after my Decease by my Executor hereafter named; First I give & bequeath unto my Loving wife Margaret Lyon her thirds of all my Estate Real & personal & that she shall have one Cow taken off the Stall for repairing her House she now lives in & the Remainder of the said Cows price to her use, Together with her Bed & Household Furniture she know possesseth such as her Chest for Pan & Spatter; & further that my son Peter Lyon shall be obliged to find her Mother wood for firing and y^e sufficiently & full During her Lifetime & if not Ten Shillings in Law thereof yearly & son Nicholas shall be obliged for his part to find his mother yearly three Barrels of Corn both of them Equally shall be obliged to find her yearly a sufficient Quantity of Meat & next I give & bequeath unto my Loving son Peter Lyon the Plantation where he now liveth, Together with one Hundred Acres of Land known in his possession Together with y^e orchards & fields according to a Division made before Alexander Stone & John Lyon

I Give & bequeath unto my Son Peter Lyon & Nicholas Lyon Together with
 all Movables I have in his possession & thirdly I give & bequeath unto my
 Son Nicholas Lyon one Hundred & Fifty Acres of Land lying
 along y^e Mountain now in his possession with Houses orchards & fields
 Together with such part of the Movables as he hath in possession & fourthly
 I give & bequeath unto my Daughter Elizabeth Dealey wife to John Dealey
 a certain Tract or Parcel of Land supposed to be Fifty Acres of Land lying
 along Alexand. Blane & Line & joining Millers line upon y^e Creek run-
 ning Down to the Mouth of the Spring Branch corners upon a poplar
 thence to the Head of the Spring which lyeth between both y^e said places
 & thence up y^e Road Road to Nicholas & Joynes his Line thence to the
 possession of the said Elizabeth & John Dealey for & During the said Elizabeth
 Dealey life & John Dealey his Widowhood & after the Decease of
 y^e aforesaid time the said Tract or Parcel of Land given unto the
 Elizabeth Dealey of John Dealey is to be returned unto Peter Lyon & Nicholas
 Lyon with all its Improvements & free of all Doubts & I do hereby
