In the name of god Amen. I Philip Thurmond Sen^r of Saint
Ann Parish of Allemande County being in perfect health &
Sound memory, do constitute this to be my Last will and
Testament, Revoking & Annulling all other wills and Tes-
taments, and do appoint this to be observed in the following manner
In witness I do order all those debts or dues as I owe to any
person whatsoever, shall Well & Truly paid of by my Executors
hereafter named, Item I bequeath to my dear & Loving wife, this
Tract of Land as I now live on, with the plantation and housing
and six negroes, Peter Charles, Sam, Jenny, Harmon, Aga, Three
leather beds & furniture, & the Rest of my household goods
and the third part of my Stock of all sorts, during her natural
Life or widowhood, but if she marries or it be pleased god
to call her out of this life, then the Land to be sold at the highest
Bidder, and be Equally divided among my five Sons, John
Thurmond, Benjamin Thurmond, Philip Thurmond,
William Thurmond and Thomas Thurmond, then the above
mentioned negroes, Stock & household furniture goods to be
Sold at the highest bidder, and be Equally divided among
all my children, boys and girls, Elizabeth Thurmond the
wife of John Thurmond, to have an Equal part with the Rest
at all my Decease the Tract of Land lying on Dog Creek
containing four hundred acres, joining Col. Martins Land
between Hopkins & Thomas Appleberrys Land to be sold at
the highest Bidder, and be Equally divided among my five
Sons, John Thurmond, Benjamin Thurmond, Philip Thurmond
William Thurmond & Thomas Thurmond, then all the
Rest of my negroes and Stock to be sold at the highest bidder
and be Equally divided among my children boys & girls
Elizabeth Thurmond the wife of John Thurmond an Equal
part with the Rest, and I constitute & appoint my wife
Mary Thurmond John Henderson my Son John Thurmond
and Son Philip Thurmond, all Executors of this my Last
Will & Testament, & Trustees to my wife & children, In
Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand & Seal
this Eighth day of October in the year of our Lord One
Thousand Seven hundred & Seventy three.

will In the name of god Amen, I Henry Wood of the parish of St. Andrew the Lanrity of Allimant, being weak in Body but of perfect mind & memory Thanks be given god, therefore do make this my Last will & Testament Purshing & disallowing all wills by me heretofore made, but an Principally I Recommend my Soul to god that gave it, & my Body to be Intred, in such a decent manner, as my Executors hereafter named Shall think fit, and as Touching the Temporal Estate it hath pleased god to Endow me with, after my Just debts & Charges are payed, I give & Bequeath as following, Item now I give to my Son Richard Wood, my plantation whereon I now Live containing 110 Acres with all my Stock & household furniture, and he is to maintain me & my wife ~~Agulah~~ Wood and my son Thomas saudage Wood, during my Life & theirs, Suptly & so constitute & Appoint my son Richard Wood my whole and Soul & Executor of this my Last will & Testament Aswitness my hand & Seal this 1st Day of December Anno Domini 1775
