 household Furniture Stock Cattle hogs & Whatsoever be remaining be Equally Divided
 Amongst my three Daughters Judith, Betty Smith, & Anne Thomas I Give & bequeath
 my Estate be brought to no appraisement Lastly I make & Ordain Michael Thomas

 my Grand son John Hall Trent & his heirs forever I give & bequeath to my said Daughter
 Elizabeth one Feather Bed & furniture I give to my son John Hall one Shilling I give
