In the Name of god Amen I Richard Stockton of Allemarle County  
and parish of St Anne, being Sick of Body but of Sound and  
Perfect memory, do constitute this to be my Last will and  
Testament appoint it to be my last will and Testament  
That is to say I bequeath my Soul to the Lord that gave it me  
Trusting in his mercies that he will Reserve it again and as  
for my worldly Goods, I bequeath as in former manner  
unto my Son Thomas Stockton five Shillings Sterling unto  
my Son John Stockton five Shillings Sterling unto my son  
Robert Stockton five Shillings Sterling, unto my son Saml  
Stockton five Shillings Sterling, and unto every one of my  
Daughters five Shillings Sterling a piece, I Bequeath unto  
my Son Richard Stockton, my Land & the negroe Luman also  
his mothers Death, and all the Rest of my Goods after my  
Just Debts are paid, I bequeath unto my well beloved wife  
and that it be at her disposing after my Death, I appoint  
Alexander Black, and Hugh Alexander and John D. to  
be my Executors, July 21<sup>st</sup> 1775
