In the Name of God Amen the twenty third Day of February one thousand seven hundred and fifty five That I Robert White of the Parish of Saint Annes and County of Albemarle and Colony of Virginia being very Sick and weak in Body but of perfect Memory and Mind Thanks be given to God therefore calling to Mind the Mortality of my Body and knowing that it is appointed for all men once to dye do make and ordain this my last Will and Testament what all men once to dye do make and ordain this my last Will and Testament what is to say principally and first of all I give and recommend my Soul to God that gave it and for my Body I recommend it to the Earth to be buried in a Christian like and decent Manner at the Discretion of my Executors Nothing Doubting but at the general Resurrection I shall receive the same again by the mighty Power of God and touching such worldly Estate whereon it hath pleased God to bless me in this Life I give and dispose of the same in the following manner and form Impimus it is my Will and I do ordain that in the just place that all my Just Debts and funeral Charges be paid and satisfied I then I Bequeath unto my beloved Wife Jane White whom I likewise constitute and ordain to be my whole and sole Executrix of this my last Will and Testament my Plantation I now live upon with all my moveables and every other part and Particular of whole Estate excepting one Shilling Sterling apiece to my four Brothers to wit James White William White as also one Shilling Sterling to Sister Margaret and do hereby utterly disallow and revoke and disannul all former Wills and Testament Legacies and Executors by me any wise before this Time named willed and bequeathed ratifying and confirming this and no other to be my last Will and Testament In Witness Whereof I have set hereunto my Hand and Seal the Year above written signed sealed published pronounced by the said Robert White as his last Will and Testament in the presence of us the subscribers Samuel Marial John Thompson
