This Account was presented to Albemarle County Court the thirteenth Day of November 1760 & Ordered to be Recorded Test John Nicholas Clk

*Holman's Will.* I Tandy Holman being Sick and weak but of proper Sense and Memory Do make this my last Will and Testament. As my Father in his Will ordered that if any of his Sons died without Issue that the Surviving Brothers should heir his Part; if my two Brothers William Holman & John Holman do Freely and entirely Relinquish their Claim for themselves and their Heirs Forever, their Imprimis. I give and Bequeath to my Brother William Holman my Negro Man Jack, and a Roan Horse to him & his heirs forever. Item I give and Bequeath to my Brother John Holman, & to his Heirs forever, my Negro Man Tom, my Stock of Cattle & Hogs, my white horse Called Shaver, and a Black pacing Horse which I have Bred if no owner comes for him before the Term Expires. Item I give and bequeath to my Sister Mary Rice my Negro Wench Jenny, & her Child Jenny to her and her heirs forever. Item I desire my Bay Horse may be sold at Auction and the money I give to my Niece Molly Rice, & to her heirs forever. Item I give to my Brother in Law Charles Rice, a Grey Mare, all my Wearing Clothes, my Saddle & Cloth to him and heirs Forever. Item I give and bequeath to my Nephew Tandy Rice, & to his heirs forever my Bed & Furniture, all my Pewter, half a Dozen Chairs, my Chest, Trunk, Table & Looking Glass a Case of Knives & Forks and my Gun. Item I give and Bequeath to my Sister Elizabeth Minnis, four Hundred Acres of Land on the great Bay and to her heirs Forever. Lastly I appoint William Holman, John Holman and Charles Rice, my Joynt Executors and I desire they may Continue Wiser Behave as Overseer of he Behave well till the Year Expires, and after giving him his Share, that the Crop Together with my Crop already made, be equally divided among my said Executors, which I accordingly give to them and their heirs forever. It is my Will that out of the Money arising from my present Crop, all my Debts be paid by my said Executors. I make void all former Wills & Legacies by me made or Given & Publish this only as my last will & Testament, In Testimony of which I hereunto Subscribe my Name, & affix my Seal this 20<sup>th</sup> day of November 1759 These words, and a Roan Horse interlined before signing Signed & sealed in presence of William Rice Tandy Holman (dub.)

At a Court held for Albemarle County the Thirtieth day of November 1760  
 This Writing was presented to Court by the Executors therein named whereupon  
 William Tice being Sworn deposed and said he was at the House of Tandy  
 Holman sometime before he died & saw the said Writing before it was carried  
 into the House where the said Tandy lay sick & where no Person cared to go  
 or enter except the Person who carried it & saw it after it was brought out when it  
 was signed in the manner it now is & that he heard the said Tandy de-  
 knowledge & declare the same to be his last Will. William Holman the  
 heir at Law appeared in open Court & declared he was Willing the same should  
 be Received and Recorded as the last will and Testament of the said Tandy  
 Holman whereupon it is ordered that the same be Recorded & on the motion  
 of William Holman John Holman and Charles Rice the Executors who  
 made oath according to Law Certificate is granted them for obtaining a probat  
 thereof in due Form giving Security on which they with John Mosely  
 and Martin Fley their Securities entered into & Acknowledged their  
 Bond accordingly
