 last will & Testament & Desire it may be rec^d by all as such. I therefore I most
 Humbly bequeath my soul to God my maker beseeching his most gracious
 Acceptance of it through the all sufficient mercy & Mediation of my most
 compassionate Redeemer Jesus Christ who gave himself to be a sacrifice
 most for my sins & is able to save to the utmost all that come unto God
 by him seeing he ever liveth to make intercession for them & whom I trust
 will not reject me a returning penitent sinner when I come to turn from my
 this hope & Confidence I render up my soul with comfort humbly beseeching
 the most blessed & glorious Trinity one God most Holy most merciful and
 Gracious to prepare me for the time of my Departure & then take me to
 himself into that peace & rest & incomparable felicity which he has prepared
 for all that Love & fear his Holy name Amen I give to God I give
 I give my Body to the Earth from whence it was Taken in full assurance
 of its resurrection from thence at the Last Day as for my Debts I desire
 it may be Discharged without promise of aid at the Discretion of my
 Creditors hereafter mentioned who I Doubt not will manage it with
 request prudence as to my Worldly Estate I will & positively

I give & bequeath to my son Gideon Anderson three hundred acres of Land
 on which my Plantation is that I now live to be laid off in irregular form to him &
 his heirs forever my Will & Desire is that the remainder part of my Land my bequeath
 Divided amongst my four Youngest Children William David Micajah Judah
 Anderson the eldest take the first choice which I give & bequeath to them & their
 heirs forever I then give & bequeath to William Crumwell the Tract of Land where
 he now lives supposing to be eighty or ninety acres to a more line from Cambridge
 line to Thomas Lockhart line to him & the heirs of his Body Lawfully begotten
 I then give and bequeath to my Daughter Ann Allen the Tract of Land where Negro
 Wench Hannah is to her & her heirs forever I then give & bequeath to my Daughter
 Francis Hughes one Negro man named Cooper to her & heirs forever
 I then give & bequeath to my Children Thomas Anderson James Anderson Micajah
 William Elizabeth Woodson & Agnes Peary one shilling Sterling apiece my Will
 is that after my Lawfull Debts are paid that the remainder part of my Estate
 kept together under the care of my son William Anderson & that he pay to the
 care of my Young Children & provide for them as suitable maintenance & labor
 a reasonable allowance for the same & that David Anderson may have share
 in each crop if he thinks proper to carry with him and that the said Children
 have liberty to Tidy on my said Plantation till they can settle there owning the
 that my sons Charles Gideon & William Anderson be Excluded of this my Will
 & Testament. & I Desire my Estate my not to appraise I W M M C P
 set my hand and seal the 26 Day of October one thousand seven hundred & 87
 seven
