Thanke he to Almighty God for the same do Confite & Ordain this my last Will & Testament Revoking all other Wills Testaments & Gifts whatsoever And as to my Worlthy Goods that it has pleased God to Endow me with I Disposse of in Manner & form following Viz

After all my Just & Lawfull Dette is paid I leave to my Beloved wife Sarah Cobb my Whole Estate During her widowhood and if she should Intermit my then Husband shall in the Judgment of my Lawyer hereafter named leave my Children Well and not Imbezzle the Estate or suffer it to go to Destruction. Then to her self During her Life, but if in their Judgment her Husband shall Imbezzle or suffer the Estate to go to Destruction. Then my will & desire is that my Lawyer take the Estate into their hand & Dispose of it to my Children in manner & form following Viz — I have already in my Judgment Given my son Charles Cobb Eight pounds. & Likewise my Daughter Mary Camill the same and my son Thomas Cobb to the value of Two pounds. Now my will is that at the Division of my Estate that all my Children except those above mentioned who have had Eight pounds already given them — have Eight pounds a piece made up to them — and for what shall be left of my Estate after such Division I Desire may be Equally Divided Amongst all my Children

And Lastly I Constitute & appoint my son Charles Cobb. My son Thomas Cobb & Charles Rice Executore of this my last Will & Testament in Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and affixed my seal the Eleventh day of Aug' one Thousand seven hundred
