Cobb's Will In the name of God Amen I Thomas Cobbe being now sick of Body but in perfect sense of Memory. Thanks be to Almighty God for the same do constitute and Ordain this my Last Will & Testament. Revoking all other Wills Testaments & Gifts whatsoever And as to my worldly Goods that it has pleased God to Endow me with I Dispose of in Manner & form following Viz

After all my Just & Lawfull Debt is paid - I Leave to my Belov'd wife Sarah Cobbe my whole Estate During her widowhood and if she should Antemortally Die I husband shall in the Judgment of my Executors hereafter named Use my Children Well and not Imbezzele the Estate or suffer it to go to Destruction - Then to possess it During her Life, but if in their Judgment her husband shall Imbezzele or suffer the Estate to go to Destruction - Then my will & desire is that my Executors take the Estate into their Care & Dispose of it to my Children in manner & form following Viz - I have already in my Will Given my son Charles Cobbe Eight pounds, & likewise my Daughter Mary Carrill the same and my son Thomas Cobbe to the value of Two pounds - Now my Will is that at the Division of my Estate that all my Children, except these above mentioned who have had Eight pounds already given them - have Eight pounds a piece made up to them - and for what shall be Left of my Estate after such Division I Desire may be Equally Divided amongst all my Children

And Lastly I constitute I appoint my son Charles Cobbe my son Thomas Cobbe & Charles Rice Executors of this my Last Will & Testament in Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and affixed my seal this Eleventh day of Augr one Thousand seven hundred
