 Will of Allumale, remembering the Uncertainty of Life to make
 and becom this to be my Last will in manner following
 My will & desire is that my debts be paid and my body decently
 Buried at the discretion of my Executors hereafter named
 Item I lend the Land & Plantation whereon I now Live
 Joining to the upper Side of the mouth of Hardway River
 to my Brother Benjamin Tindall for his life and at his
 Decease I give the Said Land beforementioned to my nephew
 Thomas Tindall, Son of my Said Brother Benjamin and
 his heirs for ever, and I also give my Said Nephew beforementioned
 2 negroe fellow named Tom, and one negroe wench named
 Unity to him & his heirs for ever, And the Rest of my Estate
 I also give to my Said Nephew, Except one negroe Boy named
 Sam, and that negroe Boy & his heirs, I give to my Nephew John
 Tindall & his heirs for ever.

Item I give to my Neph. Mary Tindell daughter of my
 Brother Benjamin Fifty Pounds to be paid to her when
 she arrives at the Age of Eighteen years or marries which
 said money (my Desire is) shall be raised out of the part
 Left to my Nephew Thomas Tindall

I appoint John Wathams & Edward Colles Executors of this
 my Said will, Revoking all others at any time by me before made
 Signed Seal & Published
 Delivered in presence of
 Test John Wathams
 Test Richard Cuthbert
 Test Anne Tindall
