 ly Estate wherewith it hath pleased god to bless me with in this
 life I give, demise & dispose of the Same in the following manner

and thus
 First I give & Bequeath unto Sarah my dear beloved wife
 all my Estate both Real & Personal, during her widowhood
 then my desire is, that it shall be Equally divided Among my
 Children that is Alice —

I do appoint my wife and my Son Amistead and
 William Blackwell to be my true & Sole Executors of
 this my Last will & Testament. I do hereby Revoke and
 Disannul and make void all former wills & Testaments
 made. In witness whereof, I the said William Blackwell
 hath set my hand & Seal this 23rd day of November
