to wit principally and first of all I Give and recommend my soul to God that gave it & for  
my Body I recommend it to the Earth to be buried in a Christian like and decent manner  
at the Discretion of my Executors nothing doubting but at the general Resurrection I shall  
receive the same again by the mighty Power of God and touching such worldly Estate  
wherein it hath pleased God to bless me in this life I Give devise and dispose of the  
same in the following manner & form In witness whereof my Wife and I do ordain that  
in the first Place that all my just Debt and funeral Charges be paid and satisfied  
Item I Give and bequeath unto my well beloved Wife Elizabeth Miller whom I likewise  
constitute and ordain to be my only and sole Executrix of this my last Will and  
Testament all my Moveables that is to say all my Horses and Mares Chattle Hogs &  
Sheep together with all my household Furniture to be at her free disposal and they  
Benefit and Enjoying of the Plantation I now live on during her Lifetime if she  
remains a Widow Item I bequeath unto my well beloved Son Samuel Miller that  
two hundred acres of Land lying and being upon the Cove Creek which I  
purchased from John Burns to him and assigns for ever Item I leave and  
bequeath unto my well beloved Sons John and Robert the Plantation and Land  
containing and the same viz: the Improvements and the Land to be  
equally divided both with respect to the Quantity and Quality as may  
be between these two aforesaid to them their Heirs & assigns for ever  
always provided that their Mother is to have her privileges above  
and I do hereby utterly disallow & revoke and disannul all and every other  
former Testaments Wills Legacies and Executors by me in any way  
before this Time made written & bequeathed ratifying and confirming  
this & no other to be my last Will and Testament In witness whereof  
I have hereunto set my Hand & Seal the Day and Year above written  
signed sealed published pronounced by the said William Miller as his  
last Will and Testament in the Presence of us the Subscribers

At a Court held for Albemarle County the eighth Day of March 1766  
The last Will and Testament of William Miller dead was presented

presented in Court and proved by the oath of James Barnett and Robert  
White one of the witnesses thereto and ordered to be recorded and in their  
motion of Elizabeth's willer Executrix therein named who made  
oath according to Law to certify for obtaining a Probate thereof and  
Term was granted giving security on which she with James Barnett  
and Alexander Henderson her securities entered into & acknowledged  
their Bond for the due and faithful Performance of the said Will

for the order of whose providence I am cheerful Resigned this is the last will  
and Testament of me Charles Lynch of the County of Albemarle & as I am  
content to Distribute what Estate I should or shall have, as follows my  
Debts and Expences of my Burial being first paid I give my oldest son  
Charles Lynch whom I appoint one of my Executors, that part of my Land  
where Benjamin Thurman Lives on viz: from the first small branch next  
below Cobbs Alias Lynches Creek down Stanton River to the mouth of latter  
River & up latter to the uppermost corner on the same & by a direct line  
from the head of the aforesaid small Branch to a corner Red Oak at  
the end of a Little Mountain on the Ridge between Briery Creek and  
Lynches Creek aforesaid and so along the line, cross Briery Creek to the  
upper corner on latter River together with five Negroes Lely, Will, Saml  
Philo, and Sarah Tamers Child when he arrives at the age of twenty on  
years if then Living or if he should die without heir of Body Law  
fully begotten then the aforesaid Land and Slaves to be divided  
between his three sons if Living or the Survivors of them and my  
Stock of Cattle and Hogs to be divided between him and my son  
Lynch. Item I give to my son John Lynch that part of my Land on the  
North Side of Stanton above his brother Charles Lynches from a  
small branch next below Lynches Creek and to extend up the Hill  
from the small Branch to a corner next below a point of Rocks op-  
posite to Clemens mill Creek and up, and along the old line both sides  
of Lynches Creek the head saving part of new Survey to be added to  
the Survey of a hundred and twenty three Acres already patented to  
make up four hundred Acres that I appoint for said also 287 Acre  
in two Surveys on both sides of Ridy Creek of Stanton River over  
Against the former with four Slaves and forty pounds for an  
Term, Pompey Peter, Easter, when he arrives at the age of twenty years if  
then Living or else to be divided between them his three brothers aforesaid  
Item I give my son Christopher Lynch the Land that Joseph Frost lives on  
And three Islands and honeys, Sacks and James Island and as far  
as black water with four Negroes and forty pounds Jack
