Morison Will In the Name of God Amen. I William Morison of  
Colony of Virginia and County of Albemarle being in Proper Health and  
Sound Memory Bless be God as this fourteenth day of March in the  
Year of our Lord God One Thousand Seven Hundred and Sixty nine and  
Publish this my last Will and Testament in manner Following  
that is to say Principally and first of all I give and recommend  
My soul into the hands of God that gave it and for my Body I recommend  
it to the Earth to be Buried in a Christian like & Decent Manner at  
the Direction of my Executors nothing Doubting but at the General  
Resurrection I shall receive the same again by the mighty power of God  
and as Touching such worldly Estate wherewith it hath pleased God  
to bless me in this life I give devise and Dispose of the same in the following  
Manner and Item after my Lawful Debts be Paid. In particular I give  
and Bequeath to my Dearly & Well Beloved Wife Rachel Morison  
The Plantation I now live on and all the Appurtenances therunto  
belonging as far as the Main Channel of the River during her life  
or Widows Hood of at her Death or Marriage I give and Bequeath the  
same to my Beloved son Ezra Morison to his heirs and assigns forever.  
Item I give and Bequeath to my well Beloved Son Joseph Morison the  
Land on the North side of the River together with an Entry on the Bayou  
Level and one on the Spring hill the former Containing 200 Acres and  
the latter 290 Acres to him and his heirs forever. Item I give to my well  
Beloved Daughter Eve Morison one Captain Tract of 200 Acres of Land  
lying on the Branches of Cuttigee Creek to her heirs & assigns  
for ever for to enjoy the same at age or Marriage. Item I give to my  
well beloved Daughter Tizzah Morison one Captain tract of 208 Acres of  
Land lying on the Branches of the Mill Creek to her heirs & assigns  
for ever for to enjoy the same at age or Marriage. And I likewise give to  
my above said Dearly and Well Beloved Mrs Rachel Morison all my  
Negroes and Movables to be Disposed of according to her Discretion together

with the assistance of my Executors but if any of the said Children should die before they Marry or come of age then their Estate to be Equally divided amongst the rest. I herein Constitute Make & Ordain Rachel Morrison my dearly and Well Beloved wife and Moses Higginbotham and James Higginbotham My only and sole Executors of this my last will & Testament I do hereby utterly Disallow and Revoke all Wills Legacies Executors Protesting and Confirming this and no other to be my last Will & Testament In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand & seal the day & year before Written. Signed Sealed & Published by the aforesaid William Morrison as and for his last Will and Testament in the Presence of us whose names are hereunder Written.
