I desire my Debts be paid out of hand I then give and bequeath to my three sons John Christian Robert Christian and Drury Christian one each of land that I now live on containing one Thousand acres to be Equally divided amongst them to them and their heirs forever I then give and bequeath to my son John Christian two new Surveyors of land the one on the River and the other Elk Island Creek branches to him and his heirs forever, I then give and bequeath to my Daughter Lucy Christian fifty Pounds I then give and bequeath to my daughter Elizabeth Christian fifty Pounds I then and if my wife should be with Child with a son then ^{to have} with any other sons equal part of land and if a daughter then with equal part with my daughters for money I then give ^{and} to my loving wife Lucy Christian all the remainder part of my estate desiring her

to bring up my Children, my daughter Lucey Christian is not
yet baptized I am also revoke all other Wills by me
formerly made and do appoint and ordain my wife Lucey
Christian and my Friend William Bradley her Brother
Executors and Executor of this my last Will Testament as witness
my hand and Seal this Twenty fifth day of March In the year
of our Lord Christ One Thousand Seven hundred and
forty and eight interlined before assigned the word
in the fourteenth line to have, I do see also that William
have revealed to work my negro five years at the lower end
of my long ground belongy the grate branch.
