

Be it known by all and any who shall see or come by this instrument that I William Brewster of
the County of New Kent in the Commonwealth of Virginia do
make and declare this my last will and testament
bearing Stom 9th day of December 1768 do
hereinafter declare forever that on a hundred acres of land which
I now own and lying along on James River on the
South side. Also I give to my son's wife and
named Sonora and one of her children or
any stock of hoggs. Item I give to my son's wife and
Daughter to them and their heirs forever one hundred
acres of land on the Creek also I give to each of my daughters
forty shillings curr^t money one each to add to their
own by earing to them I give unto my son's wife
her dower to her and her heirs forever one hundred
acres of land on the Creek also I give to each of
my daughters the right to make a mill upon
their land. It is my will that my wife shall have
for ever one hundred acres of land on the Creek

My daughter Martha I give her for ever one
Horse. I now give unto my son Thomas and his heirs
forever one Cow. Item I give to my son William and his
heirs for ever one Plow and the same shall
my Estate shall not be Appraised. I do Name also and
Appointing my Nearest Neighbor to be William
Muggins my Executor to this my last will and Testa-
ment and do acknowledge it Published and made
known writing below the name in presence of
William Muggins this day,
