

I Ann Butcher of Alexandria do make this my last Will and Testament as follows. wishing all former Wills at any time before made I devise to my Sister Rachel Tomlinson of Alexia^a an annuity of two hundred Dollars payable during her life in quarterly payments of fifty dollars. and to cease at her death. also to my said Sister I devise for her life one feather bed and one bedstead. to be selected by her three pair slacks. four blankets. three pair Pillow cases. two pillows one bolster one Counterpane the gown Wardrobe and bed Curtains one Bureau one Chamber Chair. one Rocking chair. one small Iron Androns one pair tongs and shovel the parlour looking glass one of the best Carpets one dozen of small & half dozen large blue China Plates the large China bowl one dozen of the best China tea & coffee Cups and saucers. one slop bowl. one China sugar dish. a few cut glass salts and the two salt spoons one warming pan one small tin over one spider and cover. one blue and white Counterpane of cotton & wool two small work baskets one green wicker and one for plated Candelsticks one for polished Iron Candelsticks and for snuff boxes and tray one iron and Copper tea kettle my Common table Cloth two common towels two white and gold coloured patches two cut glass fruit decanters six wine glasses four glasses Tumblers. one Iron pot and Cover one small dutch oven one large Cedar popt. all my Medicines and all my tea sugar coffee thread paper needles remnants of the many dispositions all the property devised as aforesaid to my Sister Rachel Tomlinson. for life after her death to my Niece Margaret H Shurly widow of the late Ephraim Shurly of Charles Town Virginia.

I devise my wearing apparel to my said Sister Rachel Tomlinson & my niece Rachel Hill formerly Rachil Evans to be equally divided between them. To my niece Margaret H Shurly one hundred dollars among my white Ivory knives and forks one brass wash kettle & small bell metal kettle all the said Goods one large punch dish and one large and one small punch basin. I also give and bequeath to my said Niece one thousand Dollars to paid out of my Estate also such of my plates & dishes in the large Closet up stairs as she may choose. and also my Glass window Curtains not already bequeathed also my small sheet iron Stove and heater my iron and Soap tubs. also my set of white China with Cyphor of my name on it one small Tin kitchen one franklin Stove in the front Room the shorel tongs founder Androns grate & burning hooks belonging to it the Conv Cupboard Case drawers and large dining table in the same room one pair tongs one large blue China plates and two large Around bowls and six new Chairs in the front Room.

To Ann Butcher Paton daughter of the late John B. Paton I devise my gold watch. To my niece Anne M Paton daughter of William Paton I devise my best Malagany breakfast Table. To John Butcher Grubb son of the late Count Grubb of Charles Town Virginia I devise all my Estate being one half in the lot at the corner of Prince and St Asaph Streets now share in the Capital Stock of the Bank of Alexandria which I now hold a lot of ground fifty feet in front and to extend half way through the square which to be laid off out of the square owned by the late William Paton and myself bounded by Alfred Columbus Prince & Prince Streets also the Book Case and all the books the glass Lanthorn the large Britannia Tea Pot marked B one pair brass Candelsticks. one Counterpane figure ~~one~~ ^{one} upholster work bed quilt. one small oval toilet looking glass the ruyos horse and strap one green Arm^a Chair the large blue pine Chest on Chamber walnut Table with one drawer in it one for gold sleeve buttons my Clock in the middle in dining room my glass Lanthorn one black leather traveling trunk. I give and bequeath unto William H Shurly my Liquor Case and to the said Mr. H Shurly and Charles Shurly the whole of my part of the lot division of the lot of ground situated west of the two now lots and bounded by Patrick Street & Prince Street's owned by the late Mr. Paton and myself to be equally divided between them.

To my Nephews John B Grubb and Mr. H Shurly I give and bequeath five hundred Dollars each to be put to Interest and he paid them when they shall arrive at the age of twenty one years also two beds and bedding for my said Nephew's one to each the bedstead I have been using myself I gave to the said Mr. H Shurly with my light hair traveling trunk. I also give and bequeath to Rebecca Ann Shurly and Rachel Susan Shurly a lot of ground situated on Royal Street between Wolf and Wilts Streets adjoining the property of the late William Hunter to be equally divided between them. To Rebecca Ann Shurly my new Curled Maple bedstead and one good bed and bedding for the same. one silver Cream jug one soap laddle and six good silver tea spoons and one pr. silver sugar Tong the remainder of my silver tea and table spoons I give to her sister Rachel Susan Shurly with my silver knitting shrift & baghook. To Rebecca Paton daughter of John B Paton I bequeath one sette of China marked with the Cyphor R.P. also give to Mary Jane Paton fifty Dollars to purchase a set of China such as she may choose.

3 Having provided that the annuity of two hundred dollars, to my
sister Rachel Tomlinson shall cease at her death I do hereby devise to
my niece Margaret A. Shurly the sum of five thousand to be paid
to her at the death of my said Sister to be paid to her out of the
property on which said annuity is charged All the bal of my prop-
erty of every description to be sold by my Executors as they shall think
most advantageous and thus many times to arise to be equally
divided between my Nephews and Nieces including the Children
of Rebecca Paton wife of the late John B. Paton etc as are share
I do hereby charge all the Bank Stock of which I shall die pro-
fessed with the payment of said Annuities hereby devised so far as
the dividends of such Stock will extend and direct my executors to
apply them accordingly provided on the arrival of John B. Gruell
at the age of twenty one years he shall receive his Stock separated
from this Charge if the Bank Stock prove insufficient then
subject the houses and lots or any other property I may die
professed of if not otherwise devised to be applied by my Executors
in aid of said fund and authorize and empower them to make
leases of any part of such real Estate on such rents and for such
terms of years or in fee simple as they may think proper so as to leave
any deficiency and to have full power to convey the same also
to apply the Interest of any money due to me as the lot on which
my niece Margaret A. Shurly lives is charged with an annuity of
\$20 per year and a non fourth part of the said lot belongs to the
heirs of John B. Paton and as it is my wish to give said Margar-
aret an unencumbered title to the whole of said lot I do therefore
direct my Executors to purchase out of any Estate the annuity and
to convey the same to the said Margaret and if this cannot be
done I then direct them to purchase and Convey to her as aequi-
valent another rent charge or annuity of equal value I do fur-
ther direct and enjoin my executors to exchange my fourth
part of the lot on St Asaph street with the heirs of John
B. Paton for their interest in the said lot occupied by

Margaret A. Shurly and to convey the same to the said Margaret
if that exchange cannot be effected I devise my fourth part of
said lot on St Asaph Street to the said Margaret and her Heirs
I constitute and appoint Edward Stabler and Charles Mc-
Knight Executors of this my will to which I have subscribed
my name this first day of March in the year 1826.
