The Condition of the above obligation is such that if the above bounden Elizabeth Dulany shall well and truly perform the office of Administrator of Benjamin Dulany late of Alexandria County deceased according to law and shall in all respects discharge the duties of her required by law as Administrator aforesaid without any injury or damage to any person interested in the faithful performance of said said office then the above obligation shall be void else to remain in full force and virtue in law.

In the name of God Amen, I Daniel Sinkins of the County and Town of Alexandria and district of Columbia, being extremely sick and weak but of sound and disposing mind and memory, Do make and ordain this my last will and testament First, I give and bequeath to my beloved wife Semima, all my property of every kind whatsoever, during her life or widowhood, and after her death or marriage (if she should marry) it is my desire that my property shall be equally divided between Nancy M. Carly Anderson Geestland John Foley and Rebecca Hurdle, and it is further my will and desire that if Nancy M. Carly or Anderson Geestland should die without being lawfully married, their respective parts shall be equally divided between the surviving legacies before named. In testimony of the foregoing last will and testament I have hereunto set my hand and seal this first day of November 1817.

It is my desire that my wife and Semple Smith of Fairfax county shall be executrix and executor of my will
