severally firmly by these presents sealed with our seals &  
dated this seventh day of December 1818

The Condition of the above obligation is such that if  
the above bounden Elizabeth Dulany shall well and  
truly perform the office of administratrix of Benjamin  
Dulany late of Alexandria County deceased according  
to law and shall in all respects discharge the duties of her  
required by law as administratrix aforesaid without any  
injury or damage to any person interested in the faithful  
performance of said said office then the above obligation  
shall be void else to remain in full force and virtue in law.

and Town of Alexandria and district of Columbia, being ex-  
tremely sick and weak but of sound and disposing mind and  
memory, Do make and ordain this my last will and testament  
First, I give and bequeath to my beloved wife Semima, all  
my property of every kind whatsoever, during her life or  
widow hood, and after her death or marriage (if she should  
marry) it is my desire that my property shall be equally  
divided between Nancy M. Carly, Anderson Gjestland, John  
Joley and Rebecca Hourde, and it is further my will and  
desire that if Nancy M. Carly or Anderson Gjestland should  
die without being lawfully married, their respective parts  
shall be equally divided between the surviving legacies before  
named. In testimony of the foregoing last will and testament  
I have hereunto set my hand and seal this first day of November  
1817.

It is my desire that my wife and Semple Smith of Fairfax  
county shall be executrix and executor of my will
