sound in mind and memory, but in a low state of health and being  
fully impressed with the certainty of death, and the uncertainty of the  
time thereof, and believing it necessary to arrange, as far as in my pow-  
er lies, all my worldly concerns, do hereby make, publish and declare  
the following to be my last will and testament, that is to say, I wish  
to return my soul to God who gave it, and my body to the dust, from  
whence it came, to be decently buried at the discretion of my executors  
hereinafter named. And after the payment of all my just debts and  
funeral charges, I will and bequeath, unto my well beloved mother  
Susannah Slye, all my property of every kind and description real prop-  
erty and moveable, which I am now in possession of, or may in any way  
be entitled to, whenever the same may be found, for her use and to be  
at her disposal for ever, as she may think proper. And I do hereby  
constitute and appoint, my said mother Susannah Slye to be my sole  
executrix, to carry into full effect this my last will and testament  
hereby revoking, annulling and declaring void, all other former  
wills made by me, and hereby ratifying and confirming this as my  
last will and testament. In testimony whereof I have hereunto  
set my hand and affixed my seal this fifth day of October 1819.

trators jointly and severally firmly by these presents sealed with our  
seals and dated this 28<sup>th</sup> day of October 1819.

The Condition of

the above obligation is such that if the above bounden Susanna Slye  
shall and truly perform the office of Executrix of Catharine Gillott late  
of Alexandria County deceased according to law and shall in all res-  
pects discharge the duties of her required by law as Executrix aforesaid  
without any injury or damage to any person interested in the faithful  
performance of said office then the above obligation shall cease, it  
shall otherwise remain in full force and virtue in law.
