Bowling Guardian of a Minor Bowling (orphan of Samuel Bowling deceased) her executors and administrators do and shall well and truly pay and deliver unto the said orphan all such estate and estates as now or hereafter shall come to the hands and possession of the said Guardian when the said Orphan shall attain the age of eighteen years by the next birthday, and also shall not and truly save him self and the said Judge and his successors from all trouble and damage that shall or may arise about the said Estate then this obligation to be void due to non payment full paid and delivered

Gentleman I give devise and Bequeath all my monies in in the funds and Securities for monies due and owing unto me upon Mortgage or otherwise howsoever And all my Household Furniture Plate Linen China and Books and all and singular other property either Real or personal Estate and effects whatsoever and whatsoever that I shall Die possessed or be interested in at the time of my decease unto Eleanor Fletcher my dearly beloved Wife so and during the Term of her natural life and so that the same may in no wise be subject or liable to the control of Debts or Engagements of any Husband with whom she may hereafter happen to Intermarry but that the same be at her own sole and separate use and disposal. And I direct that the Receipt of the said Eleanor Fletcher my wife or the Receipts of such person or persons whom she may appoint to receive the same shall notwithstanding her伏ture be good and sufficient discharge to the person or persons paying the same for so much Money as in such Receipt or Receipts shall be aforesaid judged or expected to be received. Then I direct and appoint the said Eleanor Fletcher my wife one of my executors of this my last Will and Testament and my much esteemed friend M. Bruce Esquire of the City of Alexandria & District of Columbia my other Executor. And I further will and bequeath (that when it shall please All mighty God to call my dearly beloved Wife Eleanor Fletcher from this life) I Bequeath all my estate mentioned in my name for her my Daughter Elizabeth Fletcher who are during her natural life and so that in no wise the same be subject or liable to the control of Debts or Engagements of any Husband with whom she may hereafter Marry, but that the same may be at her own sole use and disposal. In witness whereof I the said Thomas Fletcher the Testator have to this my last will and Testament contained in two Sheets of Paper having set my name at the bottom on the opposite side of the first sheet of paper and my Hand and seal
