1 I devise to my daughter Johanna Weaver my front house or Dwelling on the East side of Royal Street between Wolf and Wilkes Streets and an undivided moiety of the Lot of Ground on which it stands (held under a deed from Mathew Miller) to her and her heirs forever.

2 I devise to my Son Solomon Jackson the back house commonly called the Cedar post house and the other moiety of the said Lot for and during his natural life and after his death to my daughter Johanna Weaver and her heirs and it is my Will that during the life of Solomon the said Lot shall be held in common between him and the said Johanna for the accommodation of the said houses to them devised.
