The condition of the above obligation is such that if the above named Hugh Smith as Guardian of Charles James Thomas shall faithfully account with the Orphans Court of Alexandria County for the management of the property and Estate of the Orphan under his care shall also deliver up said property agreeably to the order of said Court or the directions of law; and shall in all respects discharge the duty of Guardian to said Orphan according to law; then the above obligation to be void else remain in full force and virtue in law.

To my son George all the tools and implements of his trade of plaiting and Mason also my Brass pocket pistols Hawks and powder flasks. To my son Richard my silver Watch a large spy Glass and one half the Tools and implements belong- ing to the Sash and Tann Trades.

To my son David the other half the Tools and implements of the Sash and Tann Trades and also a large pocket spy Glass also a Watch an Encyclopedia two Volumes also my Sewing piece Flute and Shot Bag also my portable Writing desk.

I direct that Thomas shall not be required of my Executors. I nominate and appoint my Sons George Richard and David my Executors of this my last Will and Testament.

1 I devise to my daughter Johanna Weaver my front house or tenement on the East side of Royal Street between Wolf and Wilks Streets and one undivided Moiety of the Lot of Ground on which it stands (held under a deed from Medeard Miller) to her and her heirs forever.

2 I devise to my Son Solomon Jackson the back house commonly called the Cedar post house and the other moiety of the said Lot for and during his natural life and after his death to my daughter Johanna Weaver and her heirs and it is my Will that during the life of Solomon the said Lot shall be held in common between him and the said Johanna for the accommodation of the said houses to them devised.

3 I devise to Johanna Jackson and to Hanson Jackson twenty five dollars each to be paid out of my personal estate if the same be sufficient and if not then to be charged on and paid out of the said House & Lot.

4 It is my desire to my Son Solomon that Nancy Love shall not be permitted to come on the said Lot or to enter his house. And as this request is made solely from a regard to his Welfare it is my hope that it will be duly obeyed by him.

5th I do hereby appoint my daughter Johanna Weaver the sole Executor of this my Will.
