First. It is my desire that all my negroes to wit; Elly, Susan, Felicia and her male child be free and emancipated.

Secondly. I give to Maria Shopp the sum of fifty dollars.

Thirdly. I give all the residue of my estate real, personal and mixed to my brother Charles Hagan to him and his heirs and assigns forever.

I appoint my friend Dennis Johnston Executor of this my last will and testament. In testimony whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this sixth day of December 1830.

Signed sealed published and declared as his last will and testament by the testator and by us signed as witnesses thereto in his presence.
