under your hand and seal the said examination and
return the same sealed, to the Register of our said

The last will and Testament of George Emperor
Hannak of Alexandria, State of Virginia, now on
board the American Ship Radius Capt. Thomas
Clark from Cork bound to New York, being

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sound of mind does bequeath the property he may
be possessed of in the manner following - That to his
lawful wife Jane Hannak he gives and bequeaths
all his property, personal and real - with the exception
of one third of the value of the whole amount
which he bequeaths, to his mother Elizabeth Isabella
Hannak Alias Dunlap - payment being first made
for all his just and lawful debts, particularly ones due
to Archibald Thompson of Philadelphia of two hundred and
fifty dollars more or less - which he requests may be
paid with the Interest from the time it was contracted
In Witness whereof the said George Emperor
Hannak thereby sets his hands and seal in the pres-
ence of the undermentioned witness on board the
Ship Radius at Sea April 11th 1841 - I do further
more appoint Thomas Inwin Merchant of Alexandria
to act as Executor to this my last will and
Testament - George E. Hannak
