A statement of facts relative to the situation of Gerard Alexander to be
presented to the Judge of the Orphans Court of Alexandria County.

The unfortunate situation of Gerard Alexander is apparent to every
person who has seen him deformed and an idiot he is entirely incompe-
tent to manage his property and would suffer the severest hardships but
for the occasional intercession and attention of some friend. His property
consists of an undivided portion of a tract of land for which he receives no
rent, and a few negroes, women and children yielding an uncertain and
inconsiderable hire. It is supposed and believed that if a guardian
could be appointed by the Orphans Court to manage the said Gerards
concerns with full authority to act in the premises that such a dispo-
sition and arrangement could be made of his property as would af-
ford him a comfortable support without the interposition of the court
it is feared he will be in a most distressed situation.
