Sealed with our seals and Dated the 21<sup>st</sup> day of Decemb. 1844

The condition of the above obligation is That if the said Robert Ball Administrator of the Goods Chattels and Credits of John Ball deceased do make a true and perfect Inventory of all and singular the goods chattels and credits of the said Deceased which have or shall come to the hands possession or knowledge of him the said Administrator or in the hands possession of any other person or persons for him and the same so made do exhibit unto the said Orphan's Court when he shall be thereunto required by the said Court. And such Goods, Chattels, and Credits do well and truly administer according to Law and further do make a just and true account of all his acting and doing therein whereunto required by the said Court: and all the rest of the Goods, Chattels and Credits which shall be found remaining upon account of the said Administrator, the same being first examined and allowed by the Judge of the said Court for the time being, shall deliver and pay unto such persons respectively as are entitled to the same by Law.

And if it shall hereafter appear that any last will and Testament was made by the Deceased, and the same be proved in Court and the Executor obtain a certificate of the probate thereof and the said Administrator do in such case being required render and Deliver up his Letters of Administration.
