This Indenture made this first day of November in the year one thousand eight hundred and eighteen, witnesseth that I Jacob Forteney of the Town and County of Alexandria and D. of Columbia doth make and ordain this to be my last will and testament hereby revoking all others Item 1st I do will and desire that all my just debts be paid for which purpose it is my will and desire that all my personal property or so much thereof be sold as will be a sufficiency to pay the same Item 2nd I do leave and bequeath to my beloved wife Rosena Forteney so long as she may continue the natural life the house and lot that I bought of Jonathan Swift and wife lying in the town of Alexandria and being on the East side of Royal street and to the southward of Queen street as a deed from said Swift & wife will more fully show and explain bearing date the eighteenth day of April in the year Eighteen hundred and twelve and recorded in July term in the said year Lib. V fo. 444 and after her death it is my will and desire that my children the dren that I may have by her at my death shall be my heirs but in case I have no children by her or that they may die before her then it is my will and desire that she be my sole heir forever Item 3rd I do leave and bequeath to my said wife all that piece parcel or tract of Land where on now stands my Stable Dwelling house and Black Smiths shop it being late the property of my Father but which fell to me by a division of his Estate after his death the said property lies adjain the Southward line of a Lott lately sold by Commissioners or Trustees for the benefit of Stromans heirs William Harover and then runs in a south
