due form of law. And on the same day letters Testamentary were granted  
to Thomas Towars the Executor therein named he having given bond  
and security according to law.

payment whereof well and truly to be made we bind ourselves our  
heirs Executors and administrators jointly and severally firmly by these  
presents sealed with our seals and dated this 18<sup>th</sup> day of February 1819  
The condition of the above obligation is such that if the above  
bounden Thomas Towars shall well and truly perform the office of  
Executor of Jan<sup>sen</sup> Beane late of Alexandria County deceased  
according to law and shall in all respects discharge the duties of  
him required by law as Executor aforesaid without any injury or dam-  
age to any person interested in the faithful performance of said  
office then the above obligation shall be void else to remain in  
full force & virtue in law.

heirs Executors and administrators jointly and severally firmly by  
these presents sealed with our seals and dated this 20<sup>th</sup> day of Feb<sup>ru</sup>  
ary one thousand eight hundred and nineteen.

The Condition  
of the above obligation is such that if the above bounden Charles  
McKnight shall well and truly perform the office of Administrator  
of John B. Paton late of Alexandria County deceased accord-  
ing to law and shall in all respects discharge the duties of him re-  
quired by law as administrator aforesaid without any injury or damage  
to any person interested in the faithful performance of said office  
then the above obligation shall be void else to remain in full force  
and value in law.
