Firstly, I Bequeath my soul to Almighty God who gave it and my Body to its kindred earth.

Secondly
I Bequeath unto my son Thomas Mayhall my lot in Fairfax County containing four three quarter acres more or less to him forever or as he may think proper to dispose of.

Thirdly
I Bequeath unto my Wife Nancy Mayhall my house and lot in Alexandria to be hers forever or to do with as she may think proper and after her death to be the property of my sons, John & Reuben Mayhall to do with as they may think proper.

Fourthly, I Bequeath unto Nancy Reuben and Alice Morgan forty Dollars each to be paid by John & Reuben Mayhall after they become of age on account of the House & Lot in Alexandria.

Fifthly, I Bequeath unto my son Stephen Mayhall my Plantation on Cape Charles River, containing three hundred acres more or less to him forever or as he may think proper to dispose of.

Sixthly, I Bequeath unto my wife Nancy Mayhall all the House hold furniture to be hers until her death, and after her death to dispose of as she may think proper.

Seventhly, I Bequeath M^r Andrew Jamieson my sold beaver, given under my hand in the year of our Lord eight hundred & seven & the second day of September.

Know all Men by these presents that we Samuel Lightfoot Alexander Perry and Culbert Morris have held and firmly bound to George Gilpin Esquire Judge of the Orphans Court for the County of Alexandria in the District of Columbia and his Successor in office in the sum of five hundred dollars to the payment whereof well and truly to be made to the said Judge and his Successor in office we bind ourselves our heirs executors and Administrators jointly and severally by these presents sealed with our seals and dated this 2^d day of February 1841.

The Condition of the above obligation is such that if the above bound Samuel Lightfoot Guardian of the Person of John Sanford of Richmond County Virginia deceased his Executors and Administrators do and shall well and truly pay unto the said Orphan all such estate and estates as now is or hereafter shall come to the hands and possession of the said Guardian within the said Orphan shall attach her will as when this is required by the said Court and also shall well and truly save harmless and indemnify the said Court and his Successor in office from all trouble and damage that shall or may arise about the said estate then this obligation to be void else to remain in full force.

At a Session of the Orphans Court for the County of Alexandria in the District of Columbia the second day of February 1841 The parties to this bond acknowledged the same to be their act and deed and it was ordered to be recorded.

A Session of the Orphans Court for the County of Alexandria in the District of Columbia the 13th day of January 1841 the last will and Testament of Samuel Mayhall deceased was proved by Cary & Donougha witnesses thereto and a decree to be thereunto and a decree the 3^d day of May 1841 the same was further proved (by Commission) by the Oath of John P. Sanford also a decree thereto and it was ordered to be recorded.
