of William Marshall Hobart Bradshaw Sarah Bradshaw Thomas Bradshaw
all of a near to Manchester in the said County and my Uncle Thomas Henson
shall of O'er Peir in the County of Chester and to my worthy old Friend
Samuel Bishop of Walworth near London the sum of one hundred pounds
each To my good Friend William Alleson of Richmond in Virginia Merchant
the sum of one hundred pounds as a small token of my respect and esteem To his
partner William Smyth the like sum of one hundred pounds and the same
kind feelings to my dear friend Matthew Smith of Baltimore Merchant the
sum of two hundred pounds To my dear Friend Thomas Smith of Alexandria
in the District of Columbia North America partner of Hugh Smith herein after
named the sum of three hundred pounds To Archibald Knightley of Liverpool
aforesaid my steady Friend and adviser the sum of one hundred pounds as a
small token of respect and also the further sum of one hundred pounds as a
compensation for the trouble that may be incurred in the business of Executor
I give my gold watch to Hugh Smith herein after named and request he will
wear it for life I beg that the said Hugh Smith will accept of my old portmanteau
wearing desk the companion of all my movements and which I hold in the
greatest estimation To John Brinkworth of Liverpool aforesaid Person makes
I give the house or manor of which I may die possessed with all the furniture
and appurtenances belonging to it this I think only justice for the great pains and
trouble he took in assisting me in the purchase of it I direct that the Legacies
duty and all other expenses whatever incident to this receipt of all the aforesaid lega-
cies gifts and bequests shall be paid out of the residue of my Estate and effects and
not be charged to the several legatees As to Silas Whiting of Liverpool aforesaid
it is my earnest wish that something should be done for him but I leave it to the said
Hugh Smith to do what he may think right in that respect as he is fully acquainted
with my views and wishes on the subject As to all the rest residue and remainder of
my estate and effects real and personal of every kind and description and whether
in Great Britain America or elsewhere I give devise and bequeath the same
unto Hugh Smith of Alexandria in the district of Columbia aforesaid Mer-
chant my dear and best friend through life to whom I am indebted for all the value

good and to his heirs executors and administrators and assigns for and during all my estate and interest therein respectively subject only to an annuity of twenty pounds which I direct to be paid by yearly payments of the term of her natural life unto Mary the Widow of Thomas Smith late of Rutherford in Clarendon their dear and kind Friend of my youth, the first payment of the said annuity to be made on the first day of January next after my decease. And I direct the duty on the said annuity and all expenses whatever of reviewing the same to be paid out of my estate and not charged to the said Hugh Smith I nominate the said Archibald Knightly as to all such part of my estate and effects as is and shall be in great Britain and Ireland Executor of this my Will and the said Hugh Smith Executor as to all the rest residue and remainder of my Estate and effects I direct that in case any of the persons to whom I have given legacies shall be found my debtors that the legacies gifts and bequests to their favor shall not be construed to release them from such debts but that such legacies gifts or bequests shall be placed to the credit of their respective accounts and the balance to be paid by or to them according to the result of such balance.
