The Condition of the above obligation is such that if the above bounden James Laurason as Guardian of Susanna H Sweet shall faithfully account with the Orphans Court of Alexandria County as directed by law for the management of the property and Estate of the Orphan under his care and shall also deliver up the said property agreeably to the order of the said Court or the directions of law and shall in all respects perform the duty of guardian to the said Orphan according to law then the above obligation shall cease it shall otherwise remain in full force and virtue in law.

The Condition of the above obligation is such that if the above bounden John Mercer shall well and truly perform the office

of Administrator with the Will annexed of Mann Page late of Gloucester County deceased according to law and shall in all respects discharge the duties of him required by law as Administrator aforesaid without any injury or damage to any person interested in the faithful performance of said office then the above obligation shall cease it shall otherwise remain in full force and virtue in law.

In the name of God Amen I Mann Page of Heath river in the County of Gloucester do make this my last will and Testament for settling my temporal concerns

I primitively leave to my beloved wife the use of her Negroe slaves and some maintenance out of my estate during her life also the use of my houses and furniture during her widow hood and my negroe woman Betty my chariot and chariot horses as her absolute property.

Item I give to my son John Page all my lands and slaves in the County of Gloucester with the stocks of all kinds thereon with my household furniture at the death or second marriage of my wife to him and his heirs forever not to interfere with my wife till her life in the ten slaves.

Item I give to my son Tom B Page all my lands & slaves in the County of Loudoun with the stocks of all kinds thereon to him and his heirs forever informing my executors however to sell so much of the said lands as will raise money sufficient to pay my debts.

Item I give to my Daughter Jane B Page two thousand pounds my negroe girl Piggy daughter of Betty and two negroe girls such as my wife shall choose for her.

Item I give to John Swanson three hundred pounds

Item I give to Philip Edwards Jones two hundred pounds

Item If either of my sons should die under age and leave no issue my will

Will and desire is that the surviving son shall have the estate herein devised to the decedent, paying to my daughter three thousand pounds over and above the two thousand pounds before given to her. If both my sons should die under age and leave no issue, then my will is that my daughter shall have all the lands and slaves and stocks which came by my wife to her and her heirs forever. And all my lands and slaves in the County of Gloucester and the stocks thereon, I give to be equally divided between my brothers to them and their heirs forever.

Item I appoint and desire my brother John Page and my friend Carter Beapter to be executors of this my last will and testament sealed with my seal and dated this 29<sup>th</sup> day of August 1798.

Imprimis. It is my will & desire that I do hereby order & direct that all my just debts be in the first place satisfied & paid Item. I do give & grant unto my slaves Monica Nell Aney & William the daughter & son of the aforesaid Monica. Also Weston Hamilton & Philip Hamilton the sons of the aforesaid Nell their full & absolute freedom & I do hereby release them from bondage & from every species of service to be rendered unto any person or persons whatsoever.

Item. I give & devise unto John Conlee & Richard Alexander Conlee the sons of my Brother Richard Alexander Conlee one Guinea each.

Item. I give & devise unto Matilda Margaret Snowden Saunders Enoch Magruder & Richard Alexander Conlee Magruder the daughter & sons of my sister Ann Magruder one Guinea each.

Item. I give & devise unto my sister Elizabeth Keith my half of that tract of land in Charles County in the State of Maryland & conveyed to us jointly by our Father John Conlee for & during her natural life & after her death. I give & devise my half of the said tract of land unto John Conlee Keith, Elizabeth Conlee Keith, Margaret Snowden Keith Jane Ann Conlee Keith & Catharine Conlee Keith the son and daughters of my said sister Elizabeth Keith to them their heirs & assigns forever to be equally divided among them

Item. All the rest & residue of my Estate of what nature or kind soever I give & devise unto the said Elizabeth Conlee Keith, Margaret Snowden Keith, Jane Ann Conlee Keith & Catharine Conlee Keith their heirs & assigns for ever.

Lastly, I appoint my sister Elizabeth Keith & James Keith & his son Carter Beapter & Carter of this my last Will & Testament. An witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand & seal this fifth day of January one thousand eight hundred & twenty
