

In the Name of God Amen I Mary De Butts
Widow and relict of Doctor Samuel De Butts formerly of the
County of Sligo in the Kingdom of Ireland and late of Prince
George's County in the State of Maryland decd, being of sound and
disposing mind and memory, but sensible of the Uncertainty of this mortal
life do make this my last Will and Testament revoking all others
Imprimis I give and devise to my daughter Mary Ann Dulaney and
her heirs forever my Farm near the Cool Springs (Charlotte Hall)
in Saint Marys County State of Maryland.

2^d I give and devise to my three Grand Children Mary Millicent
De Butts, Samuel Welby De Butts and Richardette De Butts and
their Heirs forever all my land near Leonardtown in St. Marys
County State of Maryland containing one thousand acres more or less
being part of the lands devise to my late husband by his brother John
De Butts.

3^d I give and devise to my son John Henry De Butts and his heirs
forever the farm purchased by my late husband of Nicholas Lingan
in which I now reside called Mount Welby situated in Prince
Georges County State of Maryland.

4th I give and devise to James Walker Attorney at Law near Sligo,
the Rev^d William Chambers Armstrong formerly of Sligo, and Mary Anne
De Butts full my estate in the said County of Sligo in the Kingdom of Ireland
as bequeathed to me by my late husband to hold to them and their assigns
and to the Survivors and survivor of them and the Heirs of the Survivors forever
Upon this Trust, that they or the survivors or survivor of them or the
Heirs of such survivor, shall sell and dispose of the said estate
and divide the Money arising from said Sale in the following manner
to wit - that is to say one third to my son John Henry De Butts, one third to
my daughter Mary Ann Dulaney and the other third to my three grand Children
in equal portions.

It is my Will and desire that my Executors shall pay to my Husband's
Nephew and Niece John and Elizabeth Rogoff fifty dollars each during
their natural lives. I constitute and appoint my son John
Henry De Butts and my Son in Law John Baylon Dulaney Executors of this
my last Will and Testament and Guardians of my three Grand Children
aforesaid. My Executors will recollect that one share in the Marine
Insurance Company of Philadelphia, and one share in the Insurance
Company of Philadelphia, belong to my daughter.

Mary Ann Dulaney being her own property but placed in my name the
certificates of which are in my possession. The Witness whereof I
have hereunto set my hand and seal this 10th day of January 1826.

De Butts, I do hereby bequeath the same to them with benefit of survivorship.
And I do hereby devise all the interest and property to which I may be en-
titled under the Will of my deceased brother Richard Carter Welby of London
to my daughter Mary Ann Dulaney, John H. De Butts and to my two Grand
Children Samuel Welby De Butts and Richardette De Butts as follows, to Mary
Ann Dulaney one third, to John H. De Butts one third, to Samuel Welby De Butts
one sixth each with benefit of survivorship between the said Samuel Welby
De Butts and Richardette De Butts. The Witness whereof I have hereunto
set my hand and affixed my seal this 5th day of August 1828.
