It is my Will and desire that particular attention be paid by
my Executors to the Education of my children so that their
impression may be of a proper kind I will not point out the
course but will leave it to the discretion and judgement of my
Executors in whom I strictly confide.

With respect to the distribution of my property I leave that to the
Law the provisions of which are both equitable and reasonable.
I desire that my dear Wife be permitted if she desire it to remain
in my present establishment if it is not her wish to her Executor
the property of disposing of or retaining the furniture & Liquors
and I hereby devise the said furniture and Liquors to her

It is my wish that all my just debts be paid by my Executors
as soon as possible they are to be the Judges whether that or not.
I desire that my Executors pay to each of my Sisters the annual
sum of one hundred Dollars and I desire my dear Sisters Elizabeth
and Catherine to receive it during their lives as a testimony of my
sincere affection for them.

I declare this to be my last Will and Testament all of which
is written by myself and deliver it as such this Eleventh day

the Holy Evangelists of Almighty God that the foregoing last Will and Testament of Noblest Herbert died is wholly in the hand and writing of the Testator. and be it further remembered that on the same day and year John A Washington and Bushrod C Washington two of the Executors named in the said Will qualified thereto gave bond and security according to law whereupon Letters Testamentary were granted them. The Honble Bushrod Washington the other Executor renounced his appointment
