

In the name of God. Amen- I Robert Vincent of the Town and County of Alexandria in the District of Columbia do make my Last Will and Testament in manner following. Vizt

Impresis. I direct all my Just debts and funeral charges to be fully paid out of my Estate.

Item. I give and ^{bequeath} unto Mary Ann Grimes, all my Estate real personal and mixed during her natural life only, with this injunction, that she shall not sell, mortgage, devise or in any manner dispose of the same: the rents and profits of the same only to be applied to her support.

Item. After the death of the said Mary Ann Grimes, I give devise and bequeath to my Executors hereafter named, the survivors and survivor of them, all my Real Estate, to be held by them and their heirs forever, In Trust, that they sell and dispose of the same in such manner, and on such terms as they shall think proper, and pay the proceeds thereof, together with the proceeds of my personal and mixed property, unto William Cogen and Charles Vincent or their legal representatives, to be equally divided between them: the said Cogen and Vincent are now residents of Lancashire England. Lastly, I nominate and appoint my friends Joseph Cowing and Henry Nicholson Executors of this my Last Will and Testament, and I do hereby revoke all other wills by me heretofore made. In Witness I have hereunto set my hand and seal this 30th day of ^{July} 1819 one thousand eight hundred and nineteen.
