sensible of my approaching end make this my last will and Testament  
Firstly, I Bequeath my soul to Almighty God who gave it and my Body  
to this kindred earth

Secondly

I Bequeath unto my son Thomas Mayhall my lot in Fairfax County  
containing four thousand quarter acres more or less to his forever or as he  
may think proper to dispose of

Thirdly

I Bequeath unto my wife Nancy Mayhall my house and lot in  
Alexandria to be hers forever or to be with her as she may think proper and after  
her death to be the property of my sons John & Reuben Mayhall to divide  
as they may think proper

Fourthly, I Bequeath unto Nancy Rice and Abby Virginia forty Dollars  
each to be paid by John & Rice son of Mayhall after they become of age on  
account of the House & Lot in Alexandria

Fifthly, I Bequeath unto my son Stephen Mayhall my Plantation on Cape  
Cape River, containing three hundred acres more or less to be his forever  
as he may think proper to dispose of

Sixthly, I Bequeath unto my wife Nancy Mayhall all the House hold  
furniture to be hers until her death and after her death to dispose of as she  
may think proper

Seventhly, I Bequeath Mr Andrew Sammon my old breeder given  
under my hand in the year of our Lord eighteen hundred & Seven & the  
seventh day of September

Upon the aforesaid presents that we, Samuel Lightfoot, Alexander  
Perry and Cuthbert Harris are held and firmly bound to George Gilpin  
Esquire Judge of the Orphans Court for the County of Alexandria in the  
District of Columbia and his successors in office in the sum of five hun-  
dred dollars to the payment whereof well and truly to be made by us, the said  
Judge and his successors in office, we bind ourselves our heirs executors and  
Administrators jointly and severally firmly by these presents sealed with  
our seals and dated this 2<sup>d</sup> day of February 1814

The Condition of the above obligation is such that if the above bound Samuel  
Lightfoot Guardian of Tom Sanford son of John Sanford of Richmond County  
Virginia deceased & his Executrix and Administrators do and shall well and  
truly pay unto the said Orphan aforesaid estate and estates as much as he or  
she shall come to his hands and possession of the said Guardian when the  
said Orphan shall attain his full age or when there to be required by the said  
Court and also shall well and truly say before any and sundry the members of the said Court  
and his successors of first from all trouble and damage that  
shall or may arise about the said estate then this obligation to be void  
also to remain in full force
