First I give that my body be decently and in a Christian like manner be buried agreeable to the directions of my Executors herein after mentioned and that they pay in the first place the expenses of the said burial out of my Estate.

Secondly I give devise and bequeath to my dear wife Ann Rebecca Sloan all my unright title and interest to all that I am possessed of being only personal during his natural life and after her death to be divided equally among our children that is to say one half to my son James Sloan and his heirs forever and the other half to be equally divided between my wife's two children Catherine White and Henry Miller and their heirs forever one share of Solomon Bank Stock, Charles Shales Note for Eight hundred Dollars dated December first 1814 at six months or interest Benjamin Daders note for two hundred and seventy Eight Dollars dated October 13th 1811 or interest - five shares of Tomes's stock in Alex^a the interest of all the above mentioned property to be for the support of my wife with all the household furniture also I give a present to my son James Sloan six silver table spoons 9 six tea spoons and one silver handle and I do hereby constitute and appoint my dear wife Ann Rebecca Sloan the only and sole Executrix of this my last Will and Testament in witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this 23rd day of February in the year of our Lord 1815
