

In the name of God Amen. I Thomas Tracey of Fairfax County
in the State of Virginia, mindful of the uncertainty of life and being of
sound mind and memory blessed be almighty God for the same, do make
this my last Will and Testament in form and manner following. My Will and
desire is that I be buried without any unnecessary expence, I give and bequeath
one hundred dollars to be distributed among the real objects of charity in the
Town of Alexandria. My Will and desire is that my real Estate be kept by my
Executor under his direction and superintendance for the term of seven years from
the period of my death, that the rents & profits thereof be paid to my Nephew
James Francis Tracey living at M^r Patrick Glynn tailor, 1^o 123 North
King Street Dublin, at present. At the expiration of the said term of seven years
from the period of my death, if my Nephew the said James Francis Tracey should
not then be a citizen of the United States and capable of holding real property
therein. I then give and devise the said property or real estate to my Executor —
and his Heirs forever, in Trust, that he sell the same at Public Sale upon
such terms as he shall deem most advantageous for my Estate, and pay the pro-
ceeds thence arising to him the said James Francis Tracey my Nephew.
I give and bequeath all my personal property except the Legacies herein after-
mentioned, to my Nephew the said James Francis Tracey to whom via the said
James Francis Tracey I give and bequeath all my real Estate, should he be a
citizen of the United States, to him and his heirs forever, should he be capable
of holding real property in the state of Virginia. It is well known that I have
never run debt and owe no man a shilling. Should my nephew the said James
Francis Tracey in any case die intestate or without an Heir all that I have given and
bequeathed to him I give and bequeath to the Treasurer of the Bible Society of the
District of Columbia for the time being, to the said treasurer of the Bible Society
of the District of Columbia for the time being I give and bequeath five hundred
dollars. To the Rev^d Mr Fairclough of the R^t Catholic Church of Alexandria I
give and bequeath five hundred⁰⁰. To Mr^r Alexander of Paston subject of my old friend
Charles Alexander I give and bequeath five hundred dollars. To Mrs Eliza C^r
Rankin I give and bequeath all my house hold furniture and wearing apparel
with all bonds notes, deeds or specialties I hold of her or her mother, and also two
thousand dollars. To Miss Anne Hanson of Washington City I give and bequeath
my Grand Piano with all its appurtenances, should I die possessed of one. My
music books I give and bequeath to be equally divided between Miss Anne Hanson Mrs
Hanson Mason and Mrs Rankin, Miss Anne Hanson to have the first choice
the other two ladies to draw lots for their choice in the residue. To the said Miss
Anne Hanson I give and bequeath two thousand dollars, All my other Books or
Library I give and bequeath to Philip Thomas Esq^r of West River Maryland.

I do hereby constitute and appoint Richard M Scott Esq^r of Bush Hill in the
County of Fairfax Executor of this my last Will and Testament written in my own
hand writing signed and sealed published and delivered this 30th day of July
in the year 1821 in the presence of
