The Condition of the above obligation is such that if the above bounden Richard M Scott shall well and truly perform the office of Administrator with the will annexed of John C Elles late of Alexandria County deceased according to law and shall in all respects discharge the duties of him required by law as Administrator of execs without any injury or damage to any person interested in the faithful performance of said office then the above obligation shall cease it shall otherwise remain in full force and virtue in law

I William Godfrey Adams do make and ordain the following to be my last will & Testament I give and bequeath to my Niece Jane Weston Adams; and to my Nephew William Weston Adams children of Francis Adams, all the right, title & interest which I hold, in and to any lands in the States of Virginia and Kentucky, to them and their heirs forever in equal portions.

I give and bequeath to my friend Humphrey Peake of the town of Alexandria all the residue of my estate of every kind and nature, in trust for the use & benefit of my Niece Jane R Adams & Nephew William W Adams, to be by him converted into money in such manner & at such time as he may deem proper and vested in some productive Stock according to his discretion, and my will is that the interest & dividends arising from such stock shall be paid over to my Brother Francis Adams to be by him applied to the maintenance & education of my Niece & Nephew aforesaid And my will further is that when my said Niece or Nephew respectively shall come of age or my niece aforesaid shall marry the portion of stock to which they will be respectively entitled shall be delivered over & paid to them My will is that my negro man Jack shall be sold for the term of ten years to some good master with a condition that he shall not be carried out of the District of Columbia or State of Virginia without his consent and that after the lapse of the said ten years he shall be free Lastly I constitute and appoint my friend Humphrey Peake Executor of this my will In Testimony whereof I have set my hand & affixed my seal this 27th day of May 1821

After the death of my wife I give out of my estate which shall then be left the sum of Twenty dollars to my son Louis and twenty dollars to my daughter Martha, and ten dollars to my daughter Betsy and ten dollars to my daughter Anna, and after payment of these legacies I give and bequeath all the rest and residue of my property to my sons John and Louis and my daughter Rebecca Pescor, Mary Devaughn and my deceased daughter Martha, Betsy and Maria.

I appoint my dear wife my Executrix of this my Will In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this 28th day of January 1821
